At 8h. 5.6m. a.m., l.m.t., I observe the altitude of the sun for azimuth at cor. No. 1 of this survey. The reading on the meridian brought from cor. No. 1, H. E. S. 332, which was determined by direct observations of May 8 and 9, is set at zero and the sun was observed in the lower left and upper right quadrants of the field.
