This claim is located along Buck Creek, on rolling land.

About 5 acres can be brought under cultivation; the remainder is good pasture land. About one acres has

been cultivated in the past.

The soil along the creek bottom is a gravelly loam and the hillsides a clay formation with large embedded stones, which is suitable for pasture only.

The claim is non-mineral in character.

The claim is covered with a scattering growth of oak . timber, but it is most too small to be of any commercial value.

Numerous small seeps along the bed of Buck Creek supply sufficient water for domestic use and watering a few head of cattle through the greater part of the year, but the water is not permanent, frequently drying up in mid summer.

The claim is more suitable as a stock ranch than a farm, and it is being used for the former purpose.
