CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts or adjoining claims.

The claim of Frank L. Pendley, H. E. S. No. 368, lies about 3/4 mile down the creek in a southeasterly direction, and the claim of C. R. Allen for NW/4 NE/4 of Sec. 8, H. E. 019120, lies approximately 10 chs. to North.


