### DESCRIPTION

This claim is situated 3 miles South of Elden Mountain and 2 miles North of rim of Walnut Canyon, at an elevation of 6800 ft. It consists of an open draw which has a steep pitch to a low rim to NE. and a gradual slope to low divide on SW. The tract is practically level with a very slight slope to NW.

There is no timber upon claim with exception of a few scattered trees along South boundary.

There is no water for irrigation and none is necessary.

Water for domestic use is hauled from Big Fill Lake,

one and a half miles distant.

The soil is a rich loam, very fertile and especially adapted to raising of oat hay and potatoes. Good crops of both have been raised on this claim.

There is approximately 40 acres in cultivation.
