#### DESCRIPTION

This claim lies in what is known as the Upper Coconino Basin, approximately 4 miles southeasterly from the Grand View Hotel.

The land is very level, having a gentle slope to the 'east. The soil is a rich clay loam of apparent great depth, except about two acres in the northeast corner which is very rocky.

Good crops of rye, bats, corn, and garden truck were raised on the part of this claim in sec. 25, this season.

There are a few scattering pine, pinon and juniper trees upon this claim, but no timber of commercial value.

Water for domestic use and stock is obtained from surface tanks located on portion of claim in sec. 25, T. 30 N.,
