Curnutt, whose post office address is Kirby, Arizona. Also adjoining unlisted land on the North, East and Southwest was included in this survey. The land is agricultural in character, was desired by the entryman, and will be listed as a basis for amendment of his entry No. 023353; application No. 433, dated October 1. 1913. Surveyed under Acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1915, together with special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated September 23, 1915, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 406. Situated in what will probably be; when surveyed, secs. 27 and 34, T. 6 N.; R. 14 E.; Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, within the Tonto National Forest, Arizona.

Survey commenced March 27, 1916, and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit No. 12953, pro'vided with prism eye piece, stadia wires, vertical circle, and Burt solar attachment. The horizontal limb of the transit has two double verniers placed opposite each other and graduated to single minutes of arc, which is also the graduation upon the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

I test the adjustments of the transit and solar attachment and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape graduated to links and tenths. The slope
