Situated in what will probably be when surveyed sec-. tion 27, T. 9 N., R. 5 E., G. and S. R. B. and M. within the Prescott National Forest, Arizona.

Survey commenced December 7, 1915 and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit No. 12953 provided with prism eye piece, stadia wires, 'vertical circle, and Burt solar attachment. The horizontal limb of the transit has two double verniers placed opposite to each other and graduated to single minutes of arc, which is also the graduation upon the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

I test the adjustments of the transit and solar attachment and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal; and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer, the vernier of which reads to our engle Pol. et obsi. degrees.
