Surveyed under Acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1915, together with special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated November 4, 1915, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 429.

Situated in what will probably be, when surveyed, sec. 12, T. 6'N., R. 13 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, within the Tonto National Forest, Arizona.

Survey commenced March 10, 1916 and executed with a W. and L. E. Gurley light mountain transit No. 12953, provided with prism eye piece, stadia wires, vertical circle and Burt solar attachment. The horizontal limb of the transit has two double verniers placed opposite each other and graduated to single minutes of arc, which is also the graduation upon the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

I test the adjustments of the transit and solar attachment and make necessary corrections:
