Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1915 together with special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona dated December 2, 1915, and · designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 439.

Situated in surveyed and accepted sec. 3, T. 2 S., R. 12 E. G. and S. R. B. and M. within the Crook National Forest, Arizona.

Survey commenced February 14, 1916 and executed with a W. and D. E. Gurley light mountain transit No. 12953 provided with prism eye piece, stadia wires, vertical . circle, and Burt sclar attachment. The horizontal limb of the transit has two double verniers placed opposite to each other and graduated to single minutes of arc, which is also the graduation upon the verniers of the latitude and declination arcs.

I test the adjustments of the transit and solar attachment and make necessary corrections.

·All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from · measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape graduated to links and tenths. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer, the vernier of which reads to degrees.
