DESCRIPTION -

This claim is situated on Gordon Canyon Creek which runs Westerly into Tonto Creek and lies at an elevation of approximately 6800 ft.

The boundary lines of claim lie on slopes of low timber ridges which surround claim on all sides.

The soil in bottom land is a clay loam of good depth and fertile, and at time of survey was producing good crops. The hillsides vary from steep rock, nontillable with shallow soil, to gently sloping with fair soil.

Timber is a mixed stand of yellow pine, oak and walnut and extends from 3 to 5 chs. within the claim around the entire boundary.
