#### DESCRIPTION

This claim is located along Cherry Creek, a perennial stream which furnishes sufficient water for all purposes.

About 3 acres are planted to fruit trees and farmed, and approximately 10 acres can be cultivated. The rest of

the area is steep rocky hillsides, suitable for pasture land only.

The soil along the Creek bottom and draw is a sandy loam, well adapted to fruit growing.

The hillsides are covered with dense oak brush, and the bottom land along creek is covered with cottonwood, ash and black walnut.

While this claim is located in a mineralized section, I saw no evidence of mineral upon the claim.

#### CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts or adjoining claims. H. E. S. 474 and 475 are a short distance to the South.
