IMPROVEMENTS

No improvements have been made upon this claim.

DESCRIPTION

This claim lies in an open draw along a small stream which is a tributary to South Fork of the Little Colorado.

The general slope is to the North and the elevation is approximately 8700 ft.

The timber consists of a stand of scattered and young pine along East and West boundaries.

The soil is a black clayey loam of good depth and will produce good crops.

A small creek running through the claim will furnish sufficient water for domestic use and for irrigation of arable land should irrigation be necessary.

There has been no cultivation.

I saw no indications of mineral upon the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicting or adjoining claims.

Springerville, Arizona, the nearest post office and commercial center, is 12 miles dist. Half of the distance is covered by good trail and the remainder by good wagon road.

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Our records show that Mr. Burnham Neff filed entry 028561 on October 11, 1915; the entryman was not present on August 21, 1916, when the survey was made and the claim at that time showed as signs of occupancy. The Forest Supervisor reports under date of November 16, 1918, that "Mr. Burnham Neff abandoned his claim immediately after entry and has never established residence. His present whereabouts is unknown."

The changes made in the boundaries of this claim were for the purpose of simplifying the boundaries and to eliminate unnecessary corners. In view of the fact that the area involved by the change is inconsequential, and the entry to all practical purposes abandoned, we believe no objection would be offered to survey.
