Survey commenced August 12, 1916 and executed with a Buff and Buff transit equipped with Smith solar attachment. I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections. stone and two witness trees.

All distances are horizontal and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link or eldieso steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.
