2. In balancing Latitudes and Departures do not obliterate or change the footing of the original figures, but put below them the corrected figure or figures above in red ink. Do not change the footing of the lines.

The corrections for balancing fallings should be proportional to the lengths of the lines.

3. In calculations of fallings take result to nearest link. In calculations of N. and S. areas drop all after second decimal. Surveyors are required to use the Standard Field Tables issued by the G. I. O. 4. Only three copies of this tabulation are necessary, for the District Office, the Surveyor General, and the Commissioner.
