Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906 and August 11, 1916.

Survey commenced March 22, 1917 and executed with a Buff and Buff transit No. 9702, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections. Lasted hard , vavide dell end of

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.
