## DESCRIPTION

This claim is situated near the head of Sheep Wash, which passes from N. to S., through the land, near the center of the claim. Water rises in the creek and developes into a flowing stream upon reaching the S. bdy. Water is obtained for domestic purposes and for stock from the creek.
