

Buff and Buff transit No. 9702, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

Test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.


