> No corners of the list survey could be found. The field notes of the listing survey do not properly describe the land occupied and intended to be embraced in the original listing. This survey will therefore be used as a basis for substitute listing and amendatory entry. The entryman was present at the time of survey and was satisfied with the lines as marked upon the ground. Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor General for Arizona, dated March 28, 1917, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 518.

Situated in what will probably be when surveyed Secs. 13 and 24, T. 21 S., R. 29 E., G ila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Coronado National Forest, Arizona. Surveyed under the acts of June 11, 1906 and March 4, 1917.

Survey commenced August 9, 1917 and executed with a Buff and Buff transit No. 9703, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.
