ESTABLISHMENT OF U.S.L.M. NO. 558, H.E.S. There being no public land cor. or U. S. Location Monument within two miles of this survey, I establish U. S. L. M. No. 558 H.E.S. as follows: On the lower Grapevine Mesa, about two miles South of the Globe-Roosevelt road, on the West edge of the gulch formed by Campaign Creek, and 40 feet East of the road to Jackson's ranch.
