Applicant for listing, C. E. Steward; Application No. 362, dated August 24, 1912; List No. 3-2548, dated December 6, 1913; H.E. 036983 made in the Phoenix Land Office on November 15, 1917, by Doliver G. Adkins.

The area excluded from the original listing for a road exception was included in this survey, since the road exception is no longer required by the Forest Service for the protection of Government interests.

Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor

General for Arizona, dated February 15, 1918, and designated as Homestead Entry Survey No. 561.

Situated in what will probably be when surveyed Secs. 23 and 24, T. 6 N., R. 13 E., Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, Tonto National Forest, Arizona.

Surveyed under the Acts of June 11, 1906 and May 31, 1920.

Survey commenced December 15, 1920, and executed with an A. Lietz Mining Transit, No. 6384, equipped with full verticle circle and Saegmuller Solar attachment, the horizontal limb having two double verniers placed opposite and reading to thirty seconds of arc; the verticle circle has a double vernier reading to single minutes.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The claim is situated in the bed of Workman Creek; and it is in between high, steep, rough mountains which extend down to the lines of the claim on the NE. and SW. The agricultural portion of the tract consist of 3 small flats of bottom land, lying along Workman Creek; the total area of these flats is approximately 4-1/2 acres. Of the remainder of the tract, about 3 acres is gravel and boulders in the creek bottom; and the remainder is steep, rocky, brush covered hillsides. The agricultural portion is sandy alluvium, full of humus and very fertile. Approximately 3.8 acres of the tract was cleared and

under cultivation on the date of this survey, 1 acre of which had recently been planted to young gruit trees.

All of the cultivated portion is under ditch.

Young Arizona, the nearest settlement and postoffice, is about 25 miles in a northerly direction; but that place bears little or no relation to this claim; the metropolis and trading point is Globe, which is also the County seat. It is accessable by a good automobile road.

The only timber of commercial value on the claim is a few oak and sycamore trees suitable for cordwood only, and which would probably total 40 cords; this has no value whatever at present, owing to distance from market.

There is no indication of mineral on the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts. H.E.S. No. 148 of the J.C.Carr homestead, adjoins this tract on the south, lines 1-11 of HES. 148 being identical with line 1-2 of this survey
