DESCRIPTION

The claim is comprised mainly of bottom land on Willow Creek, a tributary of Beaver Creek. The land ranges from level to gently rolling. The soil is a rich, black loam and very fertile. Approximately 100 acres of the area are suitable for agricultural purposes, of which about 80 acres show signs of having been under cultivation. The rainfall is depended upon to grow crops.

Water for domestic use may be obtained from Willow Creek or from a small spring branch east of the house. There was no one on the claim at the time of survey and the house showed no signs of recent habitation.

There is no timber of commercial value on the claim.

I saw no indication of mineral on the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts. HES. 616 joins this survey on the N., line 1 to 2 thereof being identical with line 4 to 5 of this survey. HES. 593 lies about 1/2 mile distant to the SE.
