DESCRIPTION

The claim lies entirely in the canyon of Oak Creek, consisting of about 3 acres of creek bottom land proper, and the rest lies on benches and the East slope of the canyon. The soil is a rich sandy loam and suitable for agriculture when irrigated; Oak creek furnishing abundant water for this purpose. The creek itself runs through the claim and is from two to five chains wide, taking up considerable of the land, and there are rocky points and knolls which are unfit for cultivation.

Approximately 15 acres of the claim can be placed in cultivation by clearing.

About 10 acres are in cultivation at present, most of which is orchard.

Water for domestic purposes is obtained from the irrigation ditch.

There is no indication of mineral on or near the claim. There is practically no timber of commercial value on the claim.
