I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.

At Cor. No. 1 of this survey, hereinafter described, I observe the altitude of the sun for azimuth. reading on the reference object was set at zero and the sun was observed in all four quadrants of the field. My watch is set for local mean time.
