DESCRIPTION

The claim consists mainly of bottom lands, along two small draws which drain into Pine Creek. The soil in the bottom lands is a rich sandy loam, of good depth and very fertile. Approximately 70% of the area is suitable for agricultural purposes, of which about 30 acres were under cultivation at the time of survey. The rainfall is depended upon to raise crops.

Water for domestic use is obtained from the wells. There is no timber of commercial value on the claim. No indications of mineral were observed on the claim.

CONFLICTS AND ADJOINING CLAIMS

There are no conflicts or adjoining claims. HES 591 lies about 1 mile dist. in a northeasterly direction. HES 586, 585 and 584 lie about 1-1/2 miles dist. in a westerly direction.
