Surveyed under special instructions from the Surveyor

Situated in what will probably be when surveyed Secs.
22 and 27, T. 4-1/2 N., R. 30 E., Gila and Salt River

Survey commenced June 19, 1921, and executed with a Buff and Buff transit No. 10530, equipped with Smith solar attachment.

I test the adjustments of the transit and make necessary corrections.

All distances are horizontal, and were reduced from measurements made directly on the slope with a 500 link steel tape. The slope angles were determined with a clinometer.

The courses of this survey were deflected from the meridian determined by me by Polaris observation on June 18, 1921, near Cor. No. 7 of HES. 602.
