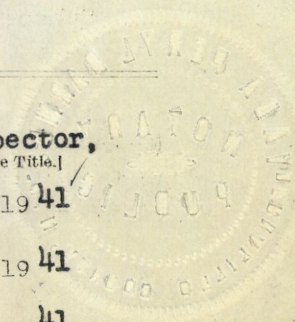

The tract of land embraced in this survey is in private ownership and was surveyed for acquisition by the United States under the Acts of March 20, 1922 and July 1, 1941.

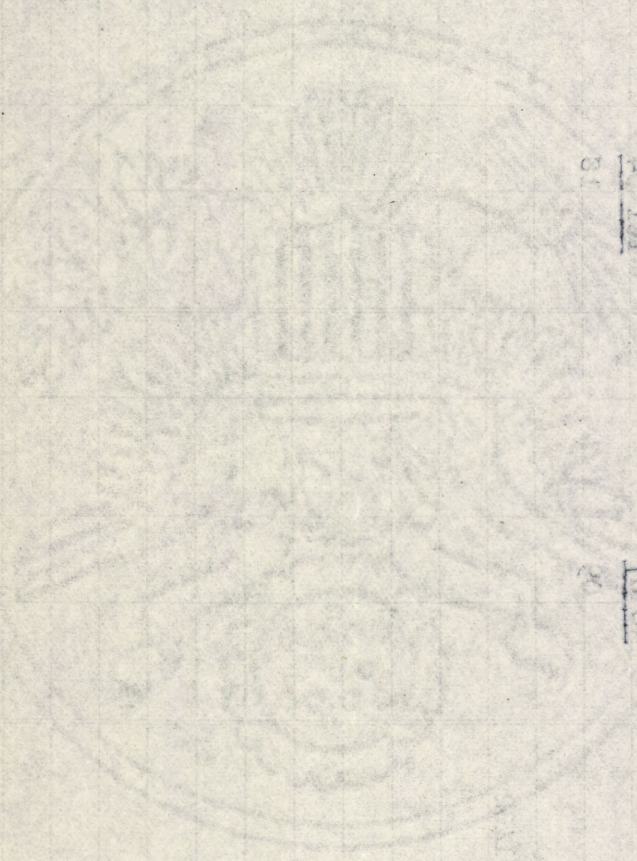
