 reopened the old Shaft of the abandoned Copper and
 Silver Mine formerly worked by Don Juan Fernandez
 and known as the Fernandez vein, said vein
 is situated about three miles west of the Indian
 rancheria called Cumabi and is from two to
 three feet wide running in a northerly and
 southerly direction upon which four different
 shafts have been sunk, varying from three
 to nine feet in depth; said vein was located
 in the month of January 1862, by your Petitioner
 and some six months previous had been worked
 by Don Juan Fernandez and by him abandoned,
 whose right, title and interest your Petitioner has
 since purchased.

Wherefore your Petitioner respectfully prays your
 Honor to denounce to his use and benefit said
 vein with all the pertenencies which appertain
 to the right of discovery so as to extend around
 and include said vein together with the use
 and benefit of all the ores, minerals, earths, wood
 water and grass, and particularly the spring
 of water situated in the canon between 200 and

300 yards from the Main Shaft of said Mine
All of which he respectfully prays may be registered according to the laws, usages and customs existing and prescribed in the mining laws of Spain and Mexico as a legal notice of his claim under the law.
