three feet wide running in a northerly and  
southerly direction upon which four different

in the month of January 1862, by your Petitioner  
and some six months previous had been worked  
by Don Juan Fernandez and by him abandoned,  
whose right, title and interest your Petitioner has  
since purchased.

Wherefor your Petitioner respectfully prays your  
Honor to denounce to his use and benefit said  
vein with all the Pertenenencias which appertain  
to the right of discovery so as to extend around  
and include said vein together with the use  
and benefit of all the ores, minerals, earths, wood  
water and grass, and particularly the spring  
of water situated in the Cañon between 200 and



300 yards from the Main Shaft of said Mine  
All of which he respectfully prays may be reg-  
istered according to the laws, usages and cus-  
toms existing and prescribed in the Mining  
laws of Spain and Mexico as a legal notice
