I found in "Ephemeris" the Sun's apparent Declination for September 2^d 1876 - 10 o'clock a.m. to be $7^{\circ}38'32''$ - Difference of time = $7^h 30^m 25^s$ - of app. Greenwich time, using Burt's improved Solar-Compass.

Magnetic Variation of needle = $14^{\circ}15'$ East.

Beginning at South-West-line of Claim at Centre of ledge at surface, I run $N. 54^{\circ}22' W.$ 5 feet, to S. W. Corner of Claim. -

Corner bears on East-line of Toronado-Claim second North-Extension of "Peckhods" and owned by Mr. Alexander.

Said Claim is situated in Peck-Mining-District, County of Yavapai, Territory of Arizona. Public Land-Survey not extended to vicinity of Claim.


