## General Description

This mining Claim is situated upon the South Eastern Slope of Mount Wasson, a prominent Peak, of Bradshaw Mountains on unsurveyed lands, about 2 miles due south of Bradshaw City and Tiger Mine. The trail runs from original Tiger mine South Easterly over foot hills till it intersects Humbug Creek - thence it turns and follows up Humbug Creek to the mine, about one half mile from junction of creek and trail, making it about  $\frac{3}{2}$  miles

by trail from Bradshaw City. Humbag  
 Creek flows at base of hill upon which  
 mine is situated. furnishes good  
 water. and plenty in winter season  
 and rainy season of summer. it  
 takes its origin about one mile East  
 of mine. flows West. & East.  
 thence Southwesterly. and empties into  
 Aqua Fria - Certain months of  
 year it becomes dry. especially in  
 places. Considerable Pine Timber  
 and a few Oaks are found upon  
 North Slope of hill. near original  
 discovery Locus of Gray Eagle mine  
 The Country rock is Granite and Slate  
 This ridge is located both north and  
 south. The location south is known  
 as 1<sup>st</sup> Eclusion North of Gray Eagle  
 mine. and now owned by Jack Moore  
 & Co. The location North of same vein  
 is called the Eclipse and is owned by  
 A. Gilmore & Co.

This lode was located

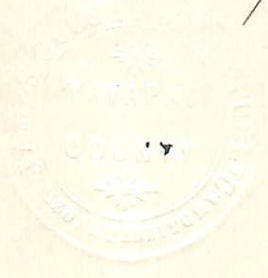
