General Description.

The Longfellow mine is located southeast
 of and adjoining the Yankee mining
 claim, the latter surveyed Nov. 11, 1872,
 and believed to be already patented by
 the United States. The Longfellow
 mine may further be described as
 lying some six miles westerly from
 the town of Cleffton which is on the
 Fresco or Francisco river and the scene
 of the offices, houses and smelting
 furnaces of the Longfellow mining company.

The Longfellow mine is one of the
 best developed in Arizona. The Com-
 pany have built expensive roads to Cleffton
 and thence to the mine and now
 directly ^{and independently} employ some 500 men about
 the mine and the furnaces and
 works at Cleffton. The ore is hauled

The ore contains no other metal than copper. A superior quality of lead is however found, in large quantities in the mine.

Certify that the value of the labor and improvements upon the Longfellow mine is not less than \$500, made and done by claimant, Henry Lasmitsky, and said improvements are as follows:

Starting at the N.W.
