

Field Notes of the  
Globe Mine  
Surveyed July 16, 1872



commencing at a monument about three feet high built of copper ore and situated on the top of the Globe Hill on a large mass of Iron & Copper Crossings being the Initial Point of the Globe and Globe ledge Mining claims, said monument being situated about one mile North of Globe City Pinal Co. A.T.

Thence S.  $24\frac{1}{4}$  E.  $4.54\frac{1}{2}$  chains to a monument of stones and earth about three and one half feet high marked Globe 1 on the N.E. side and G.d. 4. on the N.W. side said monument being situated near the bottom of the Gulch known as the "Alii" Gulch and is the South <sup>West</sup> Corner of the claim.

Thence N.  $63^{\circ} E.$   $22.73$  chains to a monument of stones and earth three feet high marked S. 2 said monument being situated on the top of the divide between the "Alii" Gulch and the Willow Spring or Munson Gulch and is the <sup>South</sup> East Corner of the claim.

Thence N.  $24\frac{1}{4} W.$   $4.54\frac{1}{2}$  chains across the "Alii" Gulch to a monument of stones and earth three feet high not marked situated near the bottom of the Buffalo Hill being the East end centre monument of this claim.

Thence  $24\frac{1}{4} W.$   $4.54\frac{1}{2}$  chains across the hill to

a monument of stones and earth about three  
and one half feet high marked G. S.  
situated on the South East slope of the  
Buffalo Hill about half way up, being the  
North <sup>East</sup> corner of this survey.

Thence S. 65° W. 22.73 Chains to a monument

The Mineral monument consists of a cedar  
post 6x6 inches 4 feet high surrounded by a  
monument of stones 3 feet high and marked  
U.S. Mineral Point, and Cadmus North corner  
a full description has been given in the  
Survey of the "Cadmus" and "Green Mountain"  
mines.

From the Initial Point to the upper left  
corner of the slide on the Buffalo N. 29 $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

From the East corner, Iron Cupid Peak bears  
N. 31° E. The east end of lime stone reef S. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$  E.  
There being no other good prominent natural  
objects in view no <sup>bearing</sup> were taken

From the Initial Point to the mouth of  
Tunnel S. 24 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. 2.10 Chains, the Tunnel is run  
on the line between the Globe and Globe  
Ledge mines and was dug in connection with  
both claims it is 100 feet long and cost  
\$ 1200.00

From the Initial Point to Shaft N. 69 $\frac{1}{2}$  E. 1.30  
Chains, the shaft is 20 feet deep and cost  
about \$ 50.00

The bearing is S. 1° and Gravel road

The claim is in rolling hills, the ore is principally Copper and Iron.

The variation of the needle is  $13^{\circ}20'$  East of North as determined by observation of Polaris.

The lines are run on true bearings.
