The American Mill Site being only marked by 4 corners and its notice of location being posted on a tree at the entrance to the Blue Nose gulch near the West side line of the claim without reference to the corner monuments, it was thought desirable to select the starting point of the survey — marked on the plat "Initial Monument" — more inside the Mill Site with a view to providing a more conspicuous place for posting a copy of the plat together with the notices — etc. etc., and for the purpose of more readily locating the improvements on the Mill Site. The corners of the American Mill Site as officially monumented fall inside the original outlines of the claim where they do not exactly agree with the old corner monuments. The area of the American Mill Site does not exceed five acres.


