# Field Notes of Survey of Tranquillity Mining Claim.

Variation of Needle as per observation of North Star

$12^{\circ} 18' \text{ East}$ .  
 Surveyed February 1880.  
 Commencing at the original Initial Monument, a mound of stones containing a copy of the Notice of Location, and which point is situate between the two shafts and two cuts of the claim and in addition is marked by a 4 inch by 4 inch by 4 ft. post bearing the letters "T.M.C." on one side and "I.M." on the other side, and running thence, - (to limit the width of the claim to 600 ft and to straighten the Easterly side line of the claim) -

$S 44^{\circ} 09' E$  5.19½ chs to a monument of stones, 4 ft. wide at the base and 2 ft. in height, being the new center of the S.Easterly sideline of the claim.

[The old and original center of the South Easterly sideline of the claim - a mound of stones - is

The Tranquillity mining claim lies between the well known Toughnut & Contention Mining Claims of the Tombstone M. D., Pima County, Arizona Territory. The road leading from the new City of Tombstone to the Contention M. C. passes nearly parallel, and within 100 ft. of the S. W. endline of said mining claim.

The Tranquillity M. C. is claimed by its first discoverers and locators Mess. Josiah H. White & W<sup>m</sup> C. Parsons. I learned from Mr. J. H. 
