$S 23^{\circ} 42' E$ 1.75 $\frac{1}{2}$ chs Direct line from Initial monument to centre of Prospect Shaft. Bearings of its 0.10 ch. sides N $57^{\circ} E$. Bearing of its 0.07 $\frac{1}{4}$ ch. sides N $33^{\circ} W$. Depth of Prospect Shaft = 0.70 chs.

$S 85^{\circ} 57' W$ 1.05 chs Direct line from S. E corner of Sulphurck marked "S.M.C.N°1" to center of Main Shaft. Bearing of its 0.07 ch. sides S $44^{\circ} W$. Bearing of its 0.10 chs. sides S $46^{\circ} E$. Depth of Main Shaft = 3.05 chs. Length of "100 ft. levels" = 2.58 chs. Bearing of "100 ft. levels" S $33^{\circ} W$. Length of "200 ft. drift" = 0.54 chs. Bearing of "200 ft. drift" N $22^{\circ} W$.

Area of Claim 19.129 acres.

This claim is bounded on the N. E. by the Head Centre, Tranquillity & Tongknut Extension Mining Claims, on the N. W. by the Sulphurck Extension ch. C., on the S. W. by the "Boss", Last Chance & Mayflower Mining Claims, and on the S. E. by the Morrison ch. C.

The Sulphurck Mining Claim approaches with its S. E. corner the Westerly Sideline of the well known Contentions ch. C. within 3.15 chains.

The road from the old Village of Tombstone to the Contentions ch. C. nearly bisects the Sulphurck ch. C., and the road from the new City of Tombstone to the

existing works of the "Contention" runs nearly parallel to that part of the boundary of the claim which lies between corners VII, VIII, I & II, of the N.E. sideline.

The Sulphurit Mining Claim, situate in the Tombstone Mining District, Pima County, Arizona Territory, is claimed by its first discoverers Messrs. Josiah White and W^m C. Parsons, and ^{by} Mr. Hamilton Diston of Philadelphia Pa.

All work on the Sulphurit Mining Claim as described above, viz.: sinking of 1 Main Shaft, driving of 2 levels, and 1 drift, sinking 1 Prospect Shaft, excavating 1 Cross Cut, has been done by the claimants Messrs. Josiah H. White, W^m C. Parsons and Hamilton Diston.
