In accordance with your letter of instructions dated March 12<sup>th</sup> 1880, I submit the following Report.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> days of March, 1880 I made an official Survey of the Princess Mine for Geo. W. Norton, A. D. Crawford and W<sup>th</sup> Lambie situated in Silver Mining District, Yuma Co. A.T. I found the Mine as described in the Notice of Location, with this exception. - What they had called "Magnetic Course" I found to be nearly true course, but as there was no conflict with adjoining claims, and the intention of the parties good, I made the Survey according to the monuments, which I enlarged and placed stakes in Centre, after taking the variation of the Needle and finding no unusual attraction. - I set a U.S. Mineral Monument at a very prominent point where it can be seen for miles. - The work done on the Mine has been done by the present Claimants, and consists of one incline shaft. - 5 x 6 feet and 54 feet deep, I made a thorough examination of the work, and am satisfied that the said shaft could not have been sunk for less than \$12.<sup>00</sup> per foot, or \$650.<sup>00</sup> for the whole. -

The formation is Granite and the Ledge clearly defined, having a dip of about 45° toward the East, and fills the entire shaft. - - -

The specimens I send you marked Princess are a very fair sample, I also send you some Lead Crystals from the same district. - -

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


Diagram of Princess Mine
