



by the Mattos claims.


The work performed by

I, Glees, hereby give witness that I, the undersigned, have this day located and claim 1500 feet along the course of this lead ladder vein of mineral bearing quartz, running from this the initial monument of stones, 750 feet in a South Easterly direction to a monument of stones, and 750 feet from the same point in a North Westerly direction to a monument of stones; together with three hundred feet on each side of the middle of said vein and all dips, spurs and angles thereof.

This claim, located under Mining Act of Congress May 10th 1872 is situated in the Gomoarba Mountains about sixty (60) miles Southwesterly from Tucson and about one half mile South Westerly from what is known as the Gomoarba Wells and shall be known as the Pocahontas Mine.
