## SURVEY OF THE EXTERIOR BOUNDARIES.

Commenced at a 4"x4" post, 6 feet long, surrounded by a mound of stones 6 feet in diameter by 3 feet in height, marked with a chisel W. U. M. C. No. 1, which is the initial monument, at the southwest end of the claim, and in the centre of said end.
