

Field Notes of the Globe Millsite (lot 42)
Surveyed June 24th 1880

By virtue of an order from Surveyor General John Wasson bearing date from 16th 1880 I have this day made an official Survey of the Globe Millsite situated at the North End of the town of Globe County of Pinal Territory of Arizona.

Beginning at the South East corner the point being marked by a monument situated in the flat on the East side of Pinon Creek at the mouth of a Gulch which runs from the East, said monument consisting of a Cedar Post 3 feet high 5 inches in diameter marked "C.M.S.E.C." in black paint, surrounded by a mound of stones 2 feet high.

Thence S. 36° W. 5.415 chains to the N.E. corner the point being marked by a monument at the foot of a small bluff on the West slope of a hill 20 feet East of Pinon Creek, said monument consisting of a cedar Post 2 1/2 feet high 4 inches in diameter marked "C.M. N.E.C." with black paint, surrounded by a mound of stones 18 inches high.

Thence S. 60° 9' W. 10.101 chains to the N.W. corner, the point being marked by a monument situated in the middle of the flat leading from Globe to the Graveyard, consisting of a cedar Post 2 feet high 5 inches in diameter marked "C.M. N.W.C." surrounded by a mound of stones 18 inches high.
