Sir: In accordance with your instructions relative to Mineral-monument and Official Survey bearing date July 1<sup>st</sup> 1880, I have the honor to submit the following data pertaining to the same.

I proceeded to the "Canon Del Oro", and after careful and thorough examination of the mineral belt crossed by said canon; on July 2<sup>nd</sup> 1880, I selected a high prominent hill situated on Easterly side of the aforesaid canon - about  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles above the old placers - heavily capped with Quartz and centrally located in the mineral belt, as the most suitable location for an initial point; and erected thereon a standard which shall be known as "Mount Ivonah" U.S. Mineral Monument; more particularly described as follows viz:

Set a white oak post 6 ft high, 7 in clear, hewed square and marked on N. side, - U.S. M. M. - on E. side - M<sup>r</sup> Ivonah; on S. side - U.S. M. M. - on W. side M<sup>r</sup> Ivonah; in mass of Quartz rock 4 ft x 4 ft at base, 2 ft high; from which the following bearings were taken;
