rocks 4 feet high built at the south
end of a large boulder $6 \times 4 \times 4$ feet
from which.

The Old Bronkow House bears
S. 69° E.

The Gird Quartz Mill bears S. $50\frac{1}{2}$ W.
at foot of hill distant about $\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

Main Shaft of the Bradshaw mine

General Description

The improvements performed by claimants
consists of a main shaft owned jointly by
the Claimants of the Bronkow, ^{and} Bronkow
Mine 1st Easterly Extension, it is 6×14 ft.
 $14\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep, with two tunnels one running
East being 6×14 ft. ^{and} the one running West
is 6×14 feet 20 feet long each.

Hence from main shaft S. $64^{\circ} \frac{1}{2}'$ 32 links
distant is a shaft which is 8×6 feet for the
first 11 feet ^{and} 14×11 feet for the next 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet
making it $13\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep.

This includes all the work performed by claimants.

Hence S. $73\frac{1}{2}'$ W. 13 chains to a shaft 18 feet
deep, 11×11 feet. Hence N. $30^{\circ} \frac{1}{2}'$ 162 chains
to an old house. These and the shaft
before mentioned on the South line of
Claim 15. 80 chains from S.W. cor. were
improvements made by parties unknown
to me.

Notice of Location. Notice is hereby given that the undersigned having complied with the requirements of the Mining Act of Congress approved May 10th 1872. and the local customs, laws and regulations have for mining purposes located Fifteen Hundred linear feet on the Bronkow Lode or Lead of Mineral bearing rock in the County of Pima ^{and} Territory of Arizona and described as follows, viz: Being located in the County of Pima A.T. on the north side of an Arroyo that empties into the Rio San Pedro from the East, and about 1½ miles from said Rio San Pedro, and about 12 miles above what is known as the Barbicoma crossing of said San Pedro River. There is a prominent hill about 3/4 of a mile from the main shaft on the lode that bears N. 50° W. and the most northerly point of the mountain known as the "Juachuca Range" bears from said main shaft S. 76° W. and distant about 16 miles. There is an old Adobe House N. 80° E. and about 200 yards from the main shaft of originally five rooms, said to have been built by one Bronkow, who was murdered at this mine. Commencing at a monument of stones situate 300 feet from centre of

main shaft and N. 24° W. from it, thence S. 66° E.
1500 feet parallel with centre of vein, to a
monument of stones, thence S. 24° E. 600 feet, passing
over centre of vein at 300 feet) to a monument of
stone, thence N. 66° E. 1500 feet parallel with
vein to a stone monument; thence N. 24° W.
600 feet to place of beginning, (passing
over centre of shaft at 300 feet.) This
location shall be known as the "Bronkou
mine" located Nov. 1st 1875.
