In accordance with your instructions under date of October 5th 1880, I have Surveyed the Dean Richmond Mining claim, Situated in the Tombstone Mining district Pima Co. Arizona, Survey applied for by C. F. Hines.

This claim covers a part of what is known as the Bronkow & 1st Easterly Extension of the Bronkow Mine, both of which have been Surveyed as I understand for a Patent, and the Courses and distances as given in my map are as I found them by actual Examination and lines ran.

Having tested my Chain and found it Correct - I obtain the Variation from Mr. Rooskrue U.S.G.M.S. who chanced to be on the ground and he obtained it from an observation of Polaris, by giving me his Courses and distances of the Bronkow and 1st Eastern Ex. which I find to correspond with my Courses and distances as aforesaid ran.
