I find upon examination of the claim upon the ground $\frac{1}{10}$ that the claim as described in the certified location notice, overlaps the Mayflower Mining Claim, therefore I run the South west line of the Mayflower Mining Claims and note the intersection of the North east end line of the Addie Mining Claim.
