General Description

This claim is situated on what is called the McCafferty Lode which is found having a Northwesterly & Southwesterly direction on the Southern Slope of the first chain of hills running East and west, North of the Arivaca creek in the Arivaca Valley. Said lode being about two miles West of Pedro Aguirre's house - in what is now called the Town of Arivaca -

This Mine is distant about Seventy two miles from Tucson in a direction about 10° west of South and in the Southern part of Arivaca Dist' Pima Co A.T.

It lies in a hollow between two long spurs or foot hills a deep gulch running nearly through the middle of the claim.

Improvements consist of Hoisting Works - Boarding House dwelling house one shaft No 1 about ^{No 2} swift deep one main shaft 180 ft deep with ten levels one at 100 ft extending 100 ft to the North and 50 ft to the South of the Main shaft the other at 150 feet in depth extending North 100 ft and South the same distance from the main shaft. At each end of lower level uprisers are commenced each worked about

30 ft. This claim is bounded on the North by the Silver Eagle on the South by the Arivaca. Improvements on this mine made by claimants exceeds five hundred dollars -

Notice of location. One call "thence east 300 feet to S. W. corner of claim" was accidentally omitted from the copy of the location notice of the Van Nostrand Mine, which was recorded April 20th 1877 in Book G. records of mines on page 54 in the office of the County Recorder of Pima County Arizona, now to correct said error and omission, in the record, said recorded location notice of said Van Nostrand Mine is hereby amended so as to read as follows.

Notice of location, Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned having complied with the requirements of Chapter 11 of Title Thirty two of the Revised Statutes of the United States and the local customs, laws and regulations have taken up and located 1500 linear feet along the McCafferty Gold and Silver bearing quartz ledge and 300 feet on each side of the center thereof which is situated in the Las Guijas mountains Arivaca District, Pima County, Arizona Territory and described as follows; Commencing at a monument of stones abt 1000 feet south of an old shaft on which a copy of this notice is posted, and running West 300 feet to a monument of stones, which is the North West corner, thence South 1500 feet to a monument of stones, which is the South West corner, thence East 300 feet to a monument of stones which is the South end center of the claim, thence east 300 feet to a monument of stones which is the South east corner of claim; thence North 1500 feet to a monument of stones which is the North east corner and thence West 300 feet to the place of beginning. 


