# Field Notes of Survey of the "Lillie Mine"

## Description

The "Lillie Mine" is situated upon the east side of the San Pedro river, and is about one and one half miles from the village of Charleston, in a southeasterly direction, and about seven and one half miles southwesterly from the City of Tombstone, in Pima Co. Arizona Territory.

Its surface is rough and uneven, being situated upon a line of rolling hills. The improvements made upon this claim, consist of a large shaft sunk near the center of the east end, also a frame building 30 x 70 feet, covering the machinery, which is used for working the mine.

The machinery consists of all the modern improvements used in Steam Hoisting Works, for raising both earth, and water, and has a capacity of working a shaft to the depth of 2000 feet.

The shaft consists of double compartments, each 4 x 4 feet - in the clear, inside of the timbers. At a depth of 75 feet a drift was run to the S.W. upon the Lillie, a distance of 75 feet.

The east end line of the Lillie Mine runs directly through the centre of the shaft, and hoisting works, placing one of the compartments of the shaft, & the half of the hoisting works, upon this claim.

Shaft No 2, represented on this Plat, was sunk by the owners of the Dauntless Claim, who supposed it to be upon their ground.

The Washington & Bradshaw Mines both border on the east end of the "Lillie".


