General Description

The Total Wreck mining claim is situated as described in the Amended Notice of location copy of which accompanies these field notes.

Upon examining the claim as actually marked upon the ground by the monuments. I found the centre line of the claim to run in an Easterly direction instead of a North-westerly as claimed in the location notice.

The 6 monuments were in good condition, the four corners being marked with a post of wood painted white and the name of the claim and description of the monument printed thereon in black letters.

By further examination I found the course of the ledge or deposit though in places very wide, to be well defined and to conform to the general direction of the claim as marked upon the ground, and to extend from the Easterly end of the claim in a Westerly direction for a distance of about Eight hundred feet, and thence on to the west, the ore is capped or covered with lime.

By reference to the field notes and plat it will be seen that all the workings of the mine are situated more than three hundred feet Easterly from the initial monument and to follow the courses as given in the notice of location would throw these workings and all visible workings outside of the exterior boundaries even allowing a full claim of 600×1500 feet.

I examined several parties as to the position of the original monuments and they all agreed that the

Survey as I have made it conformed to the only known and recognized boundaries of the Total Wreck Mining claim. And of my own knowledge these monuments occupy the same position as they did when I first visited the claim, now nearly two years ago.

In addition to this I have with big leave to forward the affidavit of A. W. Harvey who erected the original monuments on the claim.

The workings of the mine consists of one incline shaft eighty five feet deep all in ore with a twelve foot cross cut from bottom which has yet failed to develop width of the ledge.

Tunnel No 1 is in sixty feet and still being worked.

This tunnel has cut several small stringers of ore and is being run to tap the main ledge.

Tunnel No 2. has been run in about twenty feet and abandoned.

The character of ore is Carbonate of lead carrying large quantities of Chloride of Silver in the form of "Horn Silver" with some iron and occasionally copper stain.

Being about to make application for an official survey of Total Wreck Mining Claim we the undersigned owners thereof hereby give notice, that on January 16th 1879 we located and claimed said "Total Wreck" Mine duly marked the same on the ground in such manner that the boundaries thereof could be readily traced and had the notice of location which is as follows. Notice is hereby given that we the undersigned in compliance with the requirements of the mining act of Congress approved May 10, 1872, we this day locate and claim fifteen hundred feet along the course of this lead lode or vein of mineral bearing quartz and three hundred feet in width on each side of the middle of said lead lode or vein, situate in Pima County Arizona and more particularly described as follows to wit: commencing at this monument of stone being the center of the southern end of claim and upon which this notice is posted, thence eastwardly three hundred feet to a monument of stone thence fifteen hundred feet northerly to a monument of stone, thence westerly


