General Description

The Washington Mine is situate upon the east side of the San Pedro River, and about one, and one half miles from the Village of Charleston, in a southeasterly direction; and about seven, and one half miles southwesterly from the City of Tombstone, in Pima Co., Arizona Territory.

Its surface is rough, and uneven, being situate upon a line of rolling hills.

The improvements made upon this claim, by the claimants, consist of two shafts, one incline, and several houses.

No 1. as shown upon the accompanying plat, is an incline, 5 x 7 feet on the surface and sunk at an angle of about 35° from a perpendicular, dipping toward the southeast, and has reached a depth of about 70 feet, being upon a ledge, about four feet in width which increased in size, and value, as depth was attained.

Shafts nos. 2 and 3 are only about four feet in depth, and are sunk upon the croppings of the ledge.

The houses erected upon this mine were built by the claimants, and are used for the accommodation of the men who are employed upon the mine.

About one fourth of the building and machinery of the hoisting works, erected by the Bradshaw M. Co. are situated upon the extreme S.W. corner of this mine.

The north half of the "Bradshaw Mine" as shown by the monuments, is upon, and covers the south half of the "Washington Mine," owing to a mistake made by the locators, when defining their boundaries, but as both mines are owned by the "Bradshaw M. Co." there will be no adverse claim to any portion of this mine.


