General Description

The Bradshaw Mine is situated upon the east side of the San Pedro river, about one, and one half miles from the village of Charleston, in a southeasterly direction; and about seven, ^{and} one half miles southwesterly from the City of Tombstone, Pima Co - Arizona, Territory.

Its surface is rough and much broken, being situated on a line of rolling hills.

The improvements made upon this mine, by the Claimants consist of seven shafts and one Incline. Incline No 6 ^{and} shafts 7 and 8, as shown upon the plat, belong to the

"Washington Mine" as it was located prior to the Bradshaw, and covers said Decline, and shafts, they being upon the conflicting ground, as shown by the accompanying map.

Shaft No 1. is the main working shaft and has been sunk to a depth of 240 feet at the present date, and at the 75 foot level, there is a large station from which a drift has been run N. E. upon this claim for a distance of 40 feet. The West end line of Bradshaw runs through the centre of shaft.



