I this day established a U. S. mineral monument, on the mesa about 1200 feet south of Queen Creek and about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile nearly south west from the mouth of Queen Creek canon, in Pioneer dist Pinal county A. T. by planting two feet in the ground, a willow post $5\frac{1}{2} \times 5\frac{3}{4}$ inches and 4' feet and 7" inches long marked U. S. M. M. N^o. 1. From dirt to make a mound around the post I dug two pits 18×24 inches 12" inches deep one due North of post 2en(10) feet, the other due South of the post 2en(10) feet. From this monument the center of a quartzite boulder 7 feet above the ground $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide and $8\frac{1}{2}$ feet long (the long way of the boulder is east and West) bears $S 13^{\circ} 55'E$ variation $13^{\circ} 20'E$ 820. feet distance. Said boulder is the north and largest of several which lay about 300 feet west of a little well or spring, this is the only spring anywhere near.

From this monument a ^{large} quartzite boulder with a + on the top bears $S 86^{\circ} 10'E$ var $13^{\circ} 20'E$. 613.8 feet.


