Field Notes of the Survey of the Surprisor No 2 Mining Claim

I obtained the variation by an observation on the Polar Star when it was crossing the meridian variation $13^{\circ}20'E$, Survey N. 38.


Commenced at the initial monument of the Surprisor N. 2 which is on the North side of Queen Creek. Planted a cottonwood post 4×4 in 4 ft long two feet in the ground marked S. N. 2. C. N. End. thence $N 70^{\circ}15'E$ var $13^{\circ}20'E$ along the bank of the creek 300 feet to cottonwood post 4×4 in 4 ft long planted 2 ft in the ground marked S. N. 2. N. E. Cor. from this corner the centre monument on the south end of the Windsor claim ^{Lot No 37} bears $88^{\circ}30'W$ var $13^{\circ}20'E$. 10.8 feet distant, thence $S 7^{\circ}40'W$ var $13^{\circ}20'E$ 100 ft bank of creek 1500 feet to ash post 4×4 in 4 feet long, planted two feet in the ground marked S. N. 2. S. E. Cor. thence $S 70^{\circ}15'W$. var $13^{\circ}20'E$ 300 feet to ash post 4×4 in 4 feet long, planted two feet in the ground marked S. N. 2. C. S.
